PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

- 1993: After working 12 years in architecture, both in Spain and abroad, moved to the Red Sea to work professionally in diving. First job was live-aboard *Jadran*, Marina Eilat, Israel, as diveguide/deckhand.
- 1994: Moved to Hurghada (Egypt) and worked as diveguide, first in daily-diving but soon after as a cruise director of the 20 m liveaboard boat *M.Y. Hydrotec II* in South Egypt.

- 1995: Diveguide in Swiss land-based operation *Subex Diving Centre*, Movenpick Hotel, El Quseir, South Egypt.
- Summer '95 to end 97: Cruise director of the 30 m liveaboard operation M.Y. Ghazala Explorer for German-owned Sinai Divers in South Egypt. Also started publishing stories regularly for the Spanish diving magazines Apnea and Buceadores and others in Egypt and Israel.
- 1998: After logging 1500+ dives in South Egypt and becoming increasingly involved in UW photography and mapping, self-published "Diving the South, a miniguide to the Southern Egyptian Red Sea" in English and German, with the sponsorship of Scubapro Germany. A total of 8.000 copies of the booklet were distributed over the course of the next 3 years through major diving travel agencies in Europe.

 This year also combined freelancing for Ghazala Explorer with special requests like Wreck Research Expedition for the German diving magazine Unterwasser, private guiding for a superyacht, and the elaboration of the Guide to the Northern Egyptian Red Sea for The Dive Tribe diving centre in El Gouna, published online.
- 1999: Moved back to Spain to prepare the project of custom-building a 32 m traditional wooden schooner in Indonesia, to be dedicated to diving liveaboard charters.
- **2000:** Moved permanently to Indonesia to personally supervise the construction of *S.M.Y. Ondina* (www.smyondina.com), co-owned with three other partners.
- 2001: After the launching of *S.M.Y. Ondina* set up the whole diving operation, trained the crew and explored the different regions of Indonesia, both underwater and topside.
- 2002 to 2009: Successfully run the operation by living on board the *S.M.Y. Ondina* and personally guiding an average of 22 ten-day charters a year, with varying occupancy up to the maximum of 16 guests in 8 double-cabins. Management tasks also included maintenance of the boat, crew handling, paperwork and accounting.
- 2010 to 2012: Moved to Bali permanently to combine the operational of *S.M.Y.*Ondina with private guiding for yachts, writing stories for the diving and yachting magazines in Spain and the preparation of the book "Underwater Paradise: a diving guide to Raja Ampat", recently released.
